Kurniawan et al. analyze the multicultural values embedded in the *Sopo Jarwo* cartoon series. Their research demonstrates how this medium fosters diversity awareness in elementary schools, showcasing lessons in tolerance, cooperation, and harmony. Finally, Hamuddin et al. present a systematic literature review on the impact of gamification on young learners' English skills. Their work highlights gamification's capacity to enhance motivation, engagement, and academic outcomes, advocating for innovative, learner-centered approaches in English language teaching.
